Lilly has invested nearly \$4 billion in North Carolina, bringing state-of-the-art facilities and more than 1,000 new jobs to campuses in the Research Triangle Park (RTP) and Concord. These facilities produce injectable products and delivery devices for Lilly’s products, helping to connect more patients to the treatments they need for cancer, diabetes, and cardiovascular, endocrine, and neurodegenerative conditions.

Our presence in North Carolina supports the state’s economy while providing educational opportunities and workforce investments through community college collaborations and the BioWork certificate program. Through these efforts, Lilly is helping to foster the next generation of manufacturers in North Carolina.

In 2022, over 100 RTP employees volunteered for the annual Lilly Global Day of Service supporting Durham Food Bank and Hillside High School.

In November 2020, the Lilly Foundation donated a \$10,000 grant to the Durham Public Schools (DPS) Foundation in support of their commitment to Accelerating Digital Equity and committed to a



3-year \$20,000 financial partnership with DPS in 2022.

Lilly also supported Wake Tech Community College's new RTP science and technology campus with a \$1.1 million donation to support equipment, programs, and shared resources for Durham Tech and Wake Tech students to build their skills in life sciences careers.

CONCORD

The Concord site is a proud partner of the Cabarrus Regional Chamber of Commerce and Cabarrus Economic Development Corporation (EDC), and supporter of local chapters of the Boys and Girls Club, Education Foundation and Police Foundation.

Just five months after breaking ground, the Concord site held its first Lilly Global Day

of Service where the small but mighty team volunteered to support restoration efforts in a local underserved neighborhood.

In Concord and across North Carolina, Lilly provides company-contracted employee assistance programs to ensure that families have the legal, educational and mental health resources they need.

BY THE NUMBERS

Lilly has allocated:

- **\$3 million** to research groups
- **\$645 million** to **139 vendors**
- More than **\$18 million in patient assistance** through Lilly prescription assistance in North Carolina
- More than **\$99 million in medication donations** to the Lilly Cares Foundation provided for free to qualifying North Carolina residents with financial need¹
- Free donated Lilly medication through Lilly Cares Foundation to over **10,500 qualified state residents**¹

Lilly has donated to state-based foundations and nonprofits:

- More than **\$49,000** by Lilly employees
- More than **\$48,000** through the Lilly Foundation²
